### SOUTHAMPTON FOOTBALL LEAGUE

#### FINAL LEAGUE TABLES AND ANNUAL REPORT SUMMARY—SEASON 1948/49

This was the 35th Annual Report of the Southampton Football Association (S.F.A.) was presented by Mr H J Mathieson, Hon. Secretary who reported that "we can confidently claim to have recovered our pre-war status". The Junior teams distinguished themselves in the County Cup Competitions and it was recorded that the S.F.A. was represented in the finals of the Hampshire Junior Cup 'A' by A.S.T. (Hamble), in Junior Cup 'B' by Marchwood United, and in the Midweek Cup by Southampton Post Office. The Senior teams also did well in the Hampshire Intermediate Cup.

Ninety five teams took part in League Competitions last year and that number rose to 108 and Division V of the Junior League was revived to accommodate the newcomers—making six Junior Divisions in all. Nearly 3,500 players were registered with the S.F.A. during the course of the season. The enthusiasm of the participating teams was reflected in the fact that only seven fixtures were not played.

### **SOUTHAMPTON SENIOR LEAGUE (EAST)—SEASON 1948/49**

Constitution Changes—Summer 1948:

**IN:** Junior 1 champions Harland & Wolff and runners-up Austin Sports were elected to this division. Old Tauntonians Reserves (also from Junior 1) were elected to replace their reserve team who moved to the Hampshire League. Old Edwardians were elected from Junior 3.

**OUT:** Old Tauntonians (first team) and Winchester City Reserves were elected into the Hampshire League. Cunliffe-Owen found it impossible to raise a team due to company difficulties.

Annual Report Comments: To win the Senior League (East) at the first attempt was a particularly creditable performance on the part of Austin Sports, and they had a four point lead over Pirelli-General, who fell away after commencing the season in fine style. Old Tauntonians, Harland & Wolff and Warsash likewise have every reason to be pleased with their performances.

Divisional Note: S.R. (Eastleigh) Athletic changed their name to B.R. (Eastleigh) Athletic (effective from the next season). The initials B.R. stood for British Railways.

The Division extended to 14 teams for 1949/50.

Annual Report Comments: (There are also comments applicable from the Championship play-off section located beneath the Senior (East) Division). Blackfield & Langley were the undisputed Champions of this Division. Winsor United were hot on their heels for most of the season, but three defeats by the odd goal finally settled their hopes. St Nicholas Labour and Swaythling Athletic also had excellent records..

**Divisional Note:** Notes 1 and 2 relate to name changes that occurred in the summer of 1949—(1) St Nicholas Labour changed to St Nicholas. (2) Southampton Gas Company changed to Southampton Gas Employees. Note (3) The B.O.A.C. (Hythe) first team did not continue in the Hampshire League in summer 1950 and took their reserve team's place in Senior League (West) for 1949/50. Their reserves were not traced in the 1949/50 final tables (assumed disbanded).

The Division extended to 14 teams for 1949/50.

# **SOUTHAMPTON SENIOR LEAGUE PLAY-OFF MATCHES—SEASON 1948/49**

Two play-off matches took place between the East and West Champions.

It is known that the first match was at the Southampton Sports Centre and finished Austin Sports 0, Blackfield & Langley 2

There is no record of the result of the second leg that was played a week later. However:

**Annual Report Comments:** In Senior circles Blackfield & Langley proved to be the team of the season, and after winning Senior League (West) defeated Austin Sports (the winners of the Eastern Section) in the "deciders", thus pulling off the double.

#### **Additional Notes:**

- (1) The "double" subsequently became the "treble" for Blackfield & Langley as they also won the Senior Cup.
- (2) There is no further record of play-off matches taking place in the remaining seasons of two regional Senior Leagues.

Annual Report Comments: A.S.T. (Hamble) were another team to bring off the "double" (also winning the Southampton Junior Cup, having beaten Port Wing R.E. in the final). It was rather ironical to say they "pipped" Port Wing R.E. on the post and won the Junior I Championship by one point after conceding three points to the R.E.'s. Nursling St Boniface did the Trainees an excellent turn by defeating the Wing, a feat which no other team could emulate.

**Divisional Note:** 'PE' denotes promoted to Senior (East) via an election process. (1) A.S.T. stood for Air Service Training, the club played only friendly games in the previous season. (2) Sholing Sports Res had their record expunged in the previous season. (3) Solent Athletic withdrew from the division, but it is noted that a team of the same name was in Junior V in 49/50.

### STANDARD NOTES—ALL TABLES (AS APPLICABLE)

#### POS (POSITION) COLUMN

A number and no other symbol denotes the team remained in the same division for the next season.

**P** (next to position number) denotes promoted (or elected) to the next division up (an upward move of more than one division will be shown in the notes column on the far right). That team will also be shown in **BOLD** type.

**R** denotes relegated to the next division down (a move down of more than one division will be shown in the notes column on the far right). That team will also be shown in **BOLD ITALIC** type.

**X** denotes the team did not complete the following season in the league. It is possible the team either withdrew in preseason or started and withdrew in the next season as they didn't appear in the final table. If it is known what occurred to the team then the far column will show, or a relevant Divisional Note. If no note is shown then further details are unknown.

A team in italic print and shown at the end of the table without a league record denotes it is known that the team was included in that season's constitution but did not complete the season (again, the notes column may reveal what occurred, if this is known).

#### **TEAM COLUMN**

Where a team is not the club's first XI the following suffix will be shown: Res for the club's reserve team and 'A' for the club's third team. This may continue with 'B' and 'C' etc.

A comment can be seen in the note column (far right) showing the status of the team's more senior sides. Often space is restricted so F: would denote firsts; R: would denote reserves; Sr denotes Senior and Jr Junior. An example of this in the note column would be F: Sr.1; R: Jr.5 means this is the club's third team and the firsts are in Senior League 1 and Reserves are in Junior Division 5.

A team shown in **red type** are a team that is new to the Southampton Football League at the start of the season. The notes column may add further information, where it is known. It is not necessarily a newly formed team though.

A team shown in pink type has undergone a name change either during this or at the end of this season. The notes column will add further detail.

There are seasons where the goals for and against totals for divisions do not balance. Whilst these are not technically correct the tables are as published and no attempt has been made to correct them (unless otherwise stated).

#### PTS (POINTS) COLUMN

\* denotes points adjustment. Two points were awarded for a win and one each for a drawn game.

There will be occasions where notes applicable to various divisions as applicable at that particular season apply. These notes will be shown separately at the foot of that table.
