FINAL LEAGUE TABLES AND ANNUAL REPORT SUMMARY—SEASON 1949/50

Mr H J Mathieson, Hon. Secretary, presented his fifth annual report and the 36th of the Southampton Football Association. He reported that season 1949/50 was successful in every way from a playing point of view and financially it remained in a sound position.

From only 17 teams when activities League activities resumed after the war, there had been no less than 122 entries in this season—a record for the Association (at that time).

It was reported of the absence of playing pitches and more were urgently required, particularly on Southampton Common where only seven are available compared to over twenty in pre-war days. It was earnestly hoped that at least three or four more pitches will be made available on the Common.

SOUTHAMPTON SENIOR LEAGUE (EAST) — SEASON 1949/50

Constitution Changes—Summer 1949:

Like the West section, this division was extended from twelve to fourteen teams for this season.

IN: Champions A.S.T. (Hamble) and Sholing Sports Reserves were both elected from Junior 1, whilst Netley Sports had joined from the Hampshire League.

OUT: There had been one club withdrawal from the previous season—Bitterne Nomads Reserves—this club didn't take part in any competitions in this season but did recommence in summer 1950.

NAME CHANGE: S.R. (Eastleigh) Athletic became B.R. (Eastleigh) Athletic.

Divisional Note: Note (1) Eastleigh Corinthians didn't feature in the Southampton League from here but it is **possible** they formed a merger with Causton's (a local printing company) to become 'Caustons Corinthians' for the 1950/51 season and playing in the Eastleigh & District Football League.

SOUTHAMPTON SENIOR LEAGUE (WEST) — SEASON 1949/50

Constitution Changes—Summer 1949:

The numbers in both regional divisions increased from 12 to 14 for this season.

IN: Of the three new clubs shown in red in the table —B.O.A.C. had been in the Hampshire League in 1948/49, replacing their reserve team in this Division whilst Eastleigh Spartans Reserves were elected, despite having only a modest record in the Eastleigh & District League. Esso (Fawley) Res were a new team, to supplement their Hampshire League side who had up to the start of season been known as AGWI United. The Blackfield & Langley first team went to the Hampshire League and their reserves were elected in their place for this season.

OUT: No clubs left the Division (but note changes to the B.O.A.C. and Blackfield & Langley teams, detailed above).

Annual Report Comments: Junior League, Division I, provided the tit-bit of the season with Marchwood United and Port Wing R.E. neck and neck throughout. Although scoring more goals than their near neighbours, the Wing failed to keep their goal intact to the same extent, with the result that the United pipped them on the post with a superior goal average.

Without question, these teams are two of the best Juniors in the area, having been consistently prominent in past seasons, and if promoted to the Senior League they should be capable of fully holding their own.

Although outshone by the two leading teams, Nursling St. Boniface, Shirley and St. Nicholas can look back on an enjoyable season, but Odd Fellows Spors had no luck at all and captured only one point during the campaign.

STANDARD NOTES—ALL TABLES (AS APPLICABLE)



POS (POSITION) COLUMN

A number and no other symbol denotes the team remained in the same division for the next season.

P (next to position number) denotes promoted (or elected) to the next division up (an upward move of more than one division will be shown in the notes column on the far right). That team will also be shown in **BOLD** type.

R denotes relegated to the next division down (a move down of more than one division will be shown in the notes column on the far right). That team will also be shown in **BOLD ITALIC** type.

X denotes the team did not complete the following season in the league. It is possible the team either withdrew in preseason or started and withdrew in the next season as they didn't appear in the final table. If it is known what occurred to the team then the far column will show, or a relevant Divisional Note. If no note is shown then further details are unknown.

A team in italic print and shown at the end of the table without a league record denotes it is known that the team was included in that season's constitution but did not complete the season (again, the notes column may reveal what occurred, if this is known).

TEAM COLUMN

Where a team is not the club's first XI the following suffix will be shown: Res for the club's reserve team and 'A' for the club's third team. This may continue with 'B' and 'C' etc.

A comment can be seen in the note column (far right) showing the status of the team's more senior sides. Often space is restricted so F: would denote firsts; R: would denote reserves; Sr denotes Senior and Jr Junior. An example of this in the note column would be F: Sr.1; R: Jr.5 means this is the club's third team and the firsts are in Senior League 1 and Reserves are in Junior Division 5.

A team shown in **red type** are a team that is new to the Southampton Football League at the start of the season. The notes column may add further information, where it is known. It is not necessarily a newly formed team.

A team shown in pink type has undergone a name change either during this or at the end of this season. The notes column will add further detail.

There are seasons where the goals for and against totals for divisions do not balance. Whilst these are not technically correct the tables are as published and no attempt has been made to correct them (unless otherwise stated).

PTS (POINTS) COLUMN

* denotes points adjustment. Two points were awarded for a win and one each for a drawn game.
