### **TEAM SUFFIXES EXPLAINED**

Where a club had entered more than one team in the competition they are shown as 'A' (first team) and 'B' (reserve team) which is applicable in each case for this season

Where a club has entered only one team then as a general rule no suffix is shown, which therefore indicates it is their only, or first, team. However, where the team is not that club's first XI (who were playing at a higher, or senior, level in that season) then the suffix [Res] is shown to denote the club's reserve team and [3rds] is shown for their third team.
