However, they were successful in winning the prestigous Army F.A. Cup, a single goal victory against 210/10/1908; Deepcut Royal Artillery, Shoeburyness saw them through at the Army Athletic Ground, Aldershot on Easter Monday. It was the first time an Irish regiment had won the competition. The Rifles South Farnborough then won the Aldershot Charity Cup, beating the 1st Grenadier Guards in the final. The Rifles didn't stop there as they went on to win the Aldershot Senior Military League title to cap a 27th Bge.
