## Division 3 constitution changes (summer 1980)

The top eight teams made the 'cut' to be promoted to Division 2 which extended its numbers from 16 to 20 clubs. The remaining seven teams continued in a revamped Division 3 which included eleven of the twelve clubs in the discontinued Division 4. This meant Division 3 then became the lowest county league division. No new teams joined from the local associations.

Division 4 constitution changes (summer 1980)

This was the final Division 4 table as it was disbanded and eleven of the twelve teams joined the seven who finished in the bottom section of this season's Division 3.

There were a couple of interesting points to raise.

Under normal circumstances, the top two teams (in this case Folland Sports and Awbridge) would have been promoted. There was a possible argument that this should have been to Division 2 as their next season would include meeting almost all the teams they had played in this season. The flip side of this argument would be they would be playing in a division higher than those other clubs that remained in the newly constituted Division 3. Despite that, it seemed a bit harsh on the two top sides to be meeting those they'd justifiably finished above in this season when playing their league encounters in 1980/81.

Botley FC was an interesting case. Having not been re-elected the club found there was 'no room at the inn' in the Southampton League's three senior divisions and they returned to junior football, playing in Junior Division 1. A similar fate occurred to the Hythe & Dibden club when they lost their county league place in 1962. They ended up playing in Junior Division 5!! Fortunately, this type of situation can't happen to clubs now.

Incidentally, some records show the Bass (Alton) and Botley records to be the same (including the goals for and against). This is incorrect and the published final record, issued by the Hampshire Football Association, is as shown above with Botley clearly the lowest finishing team.
