FINAL LEAGUE TABLES AND ASSOCIATION ANNUAL REPORT SUMMARY—SEASON 1952/53

Another season has come and gone and in presenting my eighth Annual Report it is with pleasure I again record that the status of our Association has been well maintained. The Statement of Accounts reveals that our financial position is sound, and from the playing point of view the fact that no less than one hundred and twenty-two teams played in our League Competitions is evidence that the demand for membership of our League is as great or greater than ever.

Once again the number of Registered Players approached the 5,000 mark, and during the course of the season 7,853 goals were scored in the 1,356 League fixtures.

The report then went on to detail the cup finals (details for this season can be found in the following file 'Cup Finals—Southampton FA—Seasons Ended 1951 to 1955' available on this website). The report then summarised each Division of the Southampton League and that information can be found under the relevant Division below.

The Junior League Divisional winners will be promoted to higher Divisions in the coming season, in accordance with Rule and practice, and it is hardly necessary to say they will all be keen to justify promotion and prove their capabilities.

There were some splendid struggles in the various Divisions of the Senior and Junior Leagues and in one or two cases the Championships were not decided until the last week of the season (including Division I of the Senior League, shown beneath that Division below).

Having referred to the various League and Cup winners, I must now mention the few to whom we owe so much. I refer, of course, to the Referees who, as usual, have served us well. They seldom receive bouquets, but the Appointment Secretaries and all Referees in the Southampton F.A. area have done a grand job and once more we thank them most sincerely for all they have done, and their continued interest in the game.

SOUTHAMPTON SENIOR LEAGUE: DIVISION I— SEASON 1952/53

Constitution changes—Summer 1952:

This was a new Division following the changes to the regional East and West Divisions.

IN: The top seven finishing teams were eligible to join this Division. Five of them who'd been members of the East Section, Harland & Wolff, Austin Sports, Bitterne Park Sports, Sholing Sports Res and N.D.L.C. did so. All of the top seven from the West Section, Romsey Town Res, Swaythling Athletic Res, Winsor United, Southampton Gas Employees, St. Nicholas, Ordnance Survey and Bramtoco Sports, did so. See 'OUT' below for the other two clubs that made up the initial fourteen team membership.

OUT: Two teams from the East Division, Champions Briggs Social and Pirelli General Reserves were elected to join the Hampshire League and they were replaced by their reserve and 'A' teams respectively in accordance with a League Rule. Briggs Social Reserves had been playing in Junior Division IV, whilst the Pirelli General 'A' team were new to the League, having finished in fourth position (of twelve) in the Eastleigh & District Junior League, Division I.

Annual Report Comments: The struggle for the title was not decided until the last week of the season. It was ironical that, after being at the top of the League table from Christmas onwards, that Harland & Wolff were pipped on the post by Austin Sports. Only one point separated the teams, and the Wolves practically gave Austins the honours when they lost inexplicably to Bitterne Park Sports. Austins thus became the first winners of the newly formed Division I of the Senior League, and in view of their playing record of the past few seasons none will deny they thoroughly deserved that distinction.

Southampton Gas Employees, Bramtoco Sports and Winsor United were other teams who played well. O.S.O. (= Ordnance Survey Office) led the field for some while and then fell away badly ... Other clubs that found the going difficult were Pirelli General and Briggs Social, who, by filling the last two places in the League table, have to accept relegation to Division II in accordance with Rule.

SOUTHAMPTON SENIOR LEAGUE: DIVISION II —SEASON 1952/53

Constitution Changes—Summer 1952:

This was a new Division following the changes to the regional East and West Divisions.

IN: The bottom seven clubs from the East Section—Bitterne Nomads, B.R. (Eastleigh) Athletic Reserves, Warsash, Old Tauntonians Reserves, Old Edwardians and Netley Sports—and the clubs finishing 8th to 11th in the West Section—Shirley Warren, Marchwood United, Port Wing R.E. and Blackfield & Langley Reserves. The three other teams that formed the Division were promoted as Champions of their respective Junior Leagues—Harefield from Junior Division I and Old Bartonians from Junior Division II (with a 100 per cent record) and Grove Celtic from the Eastern Division.

OUT: Southampton Telephone Area and Esso (Fawley) Reserves appeared to disband (at least temporarily as both returned later), whilst Hythe & Dibden Reserves were relegated to Junior Division I.

ADDITIONAL NOTE: Bitterne Nomads' ground problems were resolved as they moved to their own new ground in West End Road.

Annual Report Comments: Supermarine Sports commenced the season in grand style. They failed to stay the course, however, and Old Bartonians went on to win the Championship with several points in hand. The Eastleigh team therefore completed the "double" (they also won the Senior Cup), and can look on a wonderful season.

Bitterne Nomads, who were also runners-up in the Hampshire Intermediate Cup, finished a good second in the League table, and Harefield completed their first season in Senior football by being third—a fine achievement.

Grove Celtic and Blackfield & Langley could not get going at all and had a very lean time. They did not appear to be strong enough for the opposition and a return to the Junior League would probably benefit both teams (in fact, Blackfield & Langley Reserves didn't feature in the Southampton League final tables in the next season).

Divisional Note: Port Wing R.E. also had a team in the Wednesday League in this season and they returned to play only in that Division after this campaign.

Annual Report Comments: Bitterne Nomads won the Championship with Bursledon in the runners-up position. Sarisbury Green, the Junior Cup winners, finished third, but the loss of points through the playing of unqualified players in seven games ruined their record and cost them the Shield.

Divisional Note: * denotes points adjustment (this includes Divisional Note (1) where unusually, points were **awarded** to Old Netley Boys).

(2) Harefield's first team were in Senior Division 2 and their name was changed to Harefield Sports in the next season.

This Division used to be ranked between Junior Divisions III and IV but now featured beneath Junior VI, so the two bottom teams might not have received a promotion as suggested in the table but had just moved from this regional division.

Annual Report Comments: R.A.F., Calshot rounded off an excellent season by winning the Wednesday League for the third successive year—a splendid record. Green Jackets and H.M. Customs ran them close, and on the whole there was little to choose between these three teams.

STANDARD NOTES—ALL TABLES (AS APPLICABLE)

POS (POSITION) COLUMN

A number and no other symbol denotes the team remained in the same division for the next season.

P (next to position number) denotes promoted (or elected) to the next division up (an upward move of more than one division will be shown in the notes column on the far right). That team will also be shown in **BOLD** type.

R denotes relegated to the next division down (a move down of more than one division will be shown in the notes column on the far right). That team will also be shown in **BOLD ITALIC** type.

X denotes the team did not complete the following season in the league. It is possible the team either withdrew in pre-season or started and withdrew in the next season as they didn't appear in the final table. If it is known what occurred to the team then the far column will show, or a relevant Divisional Note. If no note is shown then further details are unknown.

A team in italic print and shown at the end of the table without a league record denotes it is known that the team was included in that season's constitution but did not complete the season (again, the notes column may reveal what occurred, if this is known).

TEAM COLUMN

Where a team is not the club's first XI the following suffix will be shown: Res for the club's reserve team and 'A' for the club's third team. This may continue with 'B' and 'C' etc.

A comment can be seen in the note column (far right) showing the status of the team's more senior sides. Often space is restricted so F: would denote firsts; R: would denote reserves; Sr denotes Senior and Jr Junior. An example of this in the note column would be F: Sr.1; R: Jr.5 means this is the club's third team and the firsts are in Senior League 1 and Reserves are in Junior Division 5.

A team shown in **red type** are a team that is new to the Southampton Football League at the start of the season. The notes column may add further information, where it is known. It is not necessarily a newly formed team.

A team shown in **pink type** has undergone a name change either during this or at the end of this season. The notes column will add further detail.

There are seasons where the goals for and against totals for divisions do not balance. Whilst these are not technically correct the tables are as published and no attempt has been made to correct them (unless otherwise stated).

PTS (POINTS) COLUMN

* denotes points adjustment. Two points were awarded for a win and one each for a drawn game.

NOTES SPECIFIC TO THE CURRENT SEASON

There will be occasions where notes applicable to various divisions as applicable at that particular season apply. These notes will be shown separately at the foot of that table.
