Southampton reach the semi-final of the English (F.A.) Cup for the first time, but lose a replay to eventual cup winners Nottingham Forest The Saints also win the Southern League championship for the second consecutive season ... Royal Artillery (Portsmouth) win the Division 2 title and then win their 'Test Match' group to join Southampton in Division 1 ... Eastleigh win the second season of the Hampshire League to repeat a league and cup double which was previously achieved by Cowes ... The Gordon Highlanders won the prestigious Army F.A. Cup, the first time an Aldershot Regiment had won the trophy and beat the Royal Artillery (Portsmouth) in the final at the Army Athletic Ground, Aldershot both having beaten regiments based in Ireland at the semi-final stage. The twice finalists Gordons were not going to get another chance to win the HSC though.
